IN-KIND GIVING

Like other public charities, the AHCF depends on generous donations from private citizens and businesses to continue our good works. However, not all of the contributions that keep us running are cold, hard cash. Some are in-kind donations.

"In-kind giving" refers to contributions of goods and services that are of value to a nonprofit organization. For example, a ski resort donates the use of a villa for one week to the foundation. The retail value of the stay is \$3,000. While the use of the villa is an incredibly generous gift to the foundation, we do not realize the monetary value of the gift.

If the foundation were to raffle off the villa and sell \$4,000 in tickets, then the foundation would recognize a \$4,000 donation. However, if only \$1,000 in raffle tickets were sold, the foundation would recognize a monetary gift of \$1,000. Both very generous gifts in-kind.
