Collaborations foster ground breaking research


With completion of the AHCF Family meeting in Minneapolis this past June, it became increasingly clear that broad collaborative efforts in AHC research and awareness are needed.

Shopping for an End to AHC


Families come together in August

This web-based application allows easy, reliable event tracking through your smartphone. It is great for picking up on subtle patterns, effects of medications, and possible triggers in challenging, unpredictable disorders like AHC.

Additionally, the video interface allows you capture an event in the moment, making it easier for physicians and care providers to see an episode firsthand. Please don't let the name mislead you; I assure you the program is for more than just seizures!
